## Preoperative Instructions

1. Call the hospital or surgical center where surgery is to take place and preregister at least two days after surgery is scheduled by our office, but call no later than 4 days prior to your surgery.
2. No aspirin, Advil (ibuprophen) or aspirin-like medication for ten days prior to surgery. Tylenol may be taken for headaches or pain.
3. Call the hospital or surgical center where your surgery is to take place the day prior to surgery for instructions. They will tell you what time to be there, how long to fast and any other instructions they may have for you at that time.
4. If you are from out of the St. George area, you may need to stay the night in a motel. Dr. Doxey may want to see you early on the morning following your surgery. This typically happens at 8:10 a.m., if requested.
5. Be sure to arrange for someone to drive you home after surgery and to your postoperative visit the next day (if applicable).
